September 20th, the third Friday of the month, was recognized as POW/MIA Day. A past member of our post, Albert "Bud" Fuqua was captured when his plane was shot down over Germany in Late !944.He parachuted out and when he hit the ground, he broke his leg. Bud was a member of the then U.S. Army Air Corps and served as a gunner on a bomber that was shot down on a bombing mission.

With his leg broken, Bud could not move. After about an hour a German Wehrmaht Officer found him. The officer drew his pistol and said "BIST DER ENGLANDERODER AMERICANER?" (Are you English or American?) Bud replied American and the German officer holstered his pistol and proceeded to tend to Bud's leg. HE would spend the rest of the War in a Concentration Camp. Six months later Bud would be liberated by a Russian troop He was treated with great respect and never allow anyone to speak ill of the Russian people.

Bud was a member of VFW Post 9182, American Legion Post 164, The Order Of The Purple Heart Chapter 723 all of Katy, Texas.

When attending any public ceremony, he would always wear his Purple Heart Hat.

Meet Our Members: Peter Batura

Many of you have undoubtedly ran into Peter Batura around Post 164. So the time has come to help you know him a little bit better. Peter was Post Commander, immediately before our current commander, Sandy Krum. This among other things means he serves on our executive committee as Past Commander.

But before we get into his legion service, lets look closer at his time in the military. Peter joined the Air Force in 1983. After basic training and AIT he was stationed at Bergstrom Air Force Base then located in Austin. He was assigned to the 924th Tactical Fighter Group there, as a Laser Targeting Systems Technician. Through this he was involved in the avionics aspect of our most advanced fighters and other aircraft.

Although he never saw combat, he deployed several times. Of particular note was his participation in Operation Team Spirit 87'. He speaks about one incident, where an allied aircraft experienced systems issues. He and his team received permission to sub American spares into this aircraft and got it back in the air and on mission. He remained in the Air Force for a single six year enlistment rising to the rank of E-7.

Batura's family has a lot to be proud of when it comes to military service, and it doesn't begin or end with him. His grandfather on his father's side emigrated from Germany, and later fought for the United States in WWI. In fact Peter still has that grandfather's bayonet !Generations later his nephew, was a "mustang" going from enlisted to officer via OCS. That nephew is now a high ranking officer.

Some of the aspects of his military service that Batura remembers being the most beneficial are the analytical skills his duties built for him, and the leadership possibilities his duties provided.

Turning his attention to the Air Force, and military in general he shared some insights from his time in service. He mentioned that in his experience so called "swiss army aircraft." tended to not fulfill any of their missions as well as originally intended.

Turning his attention to the future of our military, he told me that he feels that our current generation has the heart for service that would make them excellent members of our military. He felt the issue is more the lack of the military being modeled to them by family members as an option for service. The idea being that the decreasing percentage of the population serving in the military may be a bigger part of our recruiting challenge than it is given credit for.

Batura continues to serve through the American Legion ! Not

only is he our past commander at Post 164, other examples include chartered organization representative to our two boy scout troops, and serving as a member of our honor guard among other roles.

182 Military Veterans Win 2024 Primaries for Congressional Seats

According to an analysis by Military Times, in 2024, 182 candidates with military backgrounds won their primaries for House and Senate seats. This decreased from 196 in 2022 and continues a long-term trend of fewer veterans in national office since the late 1970s.

The 2024 group includes 71 incumbents, 16 women, and 55 candidates who began military service after January 2000. Of these candidates, 53 are Democrats and 124 are Republicans. The Military Times will track these candidates throughout the election and monitor the winners as they take seats in the 119th Congress next year.
